Placements are due to commence on 22nd June 2026 and run for eight weeks

TYPES OF PROJECTS

There are no restrictions to the types of projects undergraduates can undertake as part of the Step Programme, however they must have a tangible outcome.

Previous examples have included:

- Manufacturing concept, design and development
- Setting up IT and/or accountancy systems
- Design and implementation of websites
- Marketing plans
- Design of company literature
- Analysis of production methods
- Environmental audits and follow-up work
- Research and development
